PLANTING AND MAINTAINING TREE SAPPLINGS

The camp was a huge success, with a large number of students and staff members participating in the event. The number of donors registered on Day 1 was 111 and 93 units of Blood were collected.

On day two, PMJF Ln. Mrs. S. P. Bakkiyalakshmi, immediate Past District Governor 2021-2022, Multiple Council Vice Chairman, and Ln. R. Vijayakumar, District Chairperson, Global Service Team, Ln. N. S. Gopinath, District Chairperson, Chemo Port, Ln. Dinesh Kumar, District Chairman, Hunger actively participated in the event. The number of donors registered on Day 2 was 77 and 60 units of Blood were collected. Overall 153 units of Blood were collected. The college administration and the student council extended their full support for the successful conduct of the camp. The camp was conducted in a systematic and organized manner. The blood bank team, comprising 2 doctors and 7 Lab technicians, conducted preliminary check-ups of the donors to ensure their eligibility to donate blood. The process of blood donation was carried out in a sterile environment and all necessary precautions were taken to ensure the safety of the donors. The camp was a huge success and received an overwhelming response from the students and staff. The collected blood will be used to save the lives of those in need and will go a long way in fulfilling the shortage of blood in the local blood banks.

NATIONAL LEPROSY ERADICATION PROGRAMME

(SPARSH LEPROSY AWARENESS CAMPAIGN)

Medical Support and Basic Needs for Leprosy Patients

Leprosy is a chronic infectious disease that affects the skin, peripheral nerves, and mucosal surfaces of the upper respiratory tract and eyes. Despite being curable, leprosy remains a significant public health issue in many countries.

On account of the Silver Jubilee Celebrations, the NSS Units and IQAC of Annai Violet Arts and Science College in association with Lions Club 324K, Chetpet, and the Department of Public Health and Prevention Medicine, Teynampet, Chennai, conducted an awareness program on 9th February 2023 at the College premises by providing medical support and basic needs to the individuals affected by leprosy in the local community. The Guest for the day was Mr. M. Arumugam, Non Medical Supervisor, Government of Tamilnadu, Dept. of Public Health and Prevention Medicine (Leprosy).

Manivannan, District Governor. 4 chemo ports were supplied to 4 paediatric patients.

Overall, a chemo port can improve the quality of life for the kids who are undergoing chemotherapy. It helps them have a safe, convenient, and comfortable way to receive their treatment. It can also reduce the need for repeated needle sticks and peripheral intravenous lines, which can be stressful and unpleasant for such patients.

GRANTING LIFE SUPPORT FOR CANCER PATIENTS

On the same day at the children’s ward, each packet that contained Nutritious Food, Dry Fruits, and Toys were supplied to 100 kids who were under the age of 10. Rs.10000 was contributed by Mr. K. Sriram, a student volunteer of III B. Com. (General), on request raised by the Institute of child welfare PRO Mr. Gangadharan. The decision to grant life support for cancer patients should be based on the individual patient’s wishes and medical condition and it was met out in some standards.
