The guest speaker highlighted disruptive technology such as artificial intelligence, block chain, and so on, as well as how block chain works and how it relates to household products. She further explained about the start-ups and how it is useful to redefine the economy.

Workshop on GST and its Implications on Business & Trade

On 8th Sept. '21, a workshop on “GST and its Implications on Business & Trade” was organised in which Mr. Brucelee, a tax consultant and Alumnus of our College, was the resource person. He discussed the economic development through the implementation of GST, the rise in the number of

taxpayers, and the increase in revenue. He further elaborated on how the implementation of GST has aided in the establishment of a single tax system as well as tax administration reform. In addition to this, he discussed understanding the need for GST, highlighted on GST provisions, rules, and procedures, implications of GST on current business arrangements, transition to GST from existing practices, and also on the do's and don'ts of GST with students.

Investor Awareness Programme on Securities Market

A Program on "Investor Awareness Programme on Securities Market" on 11th Sept. '21 commenced with Mr. Jeyaprakash M., MCUBE Academy, NSE-NISM Approved Trainer from SEBI as Chief Guest, who explained about the benefits of investing in the capital markets and how to go about making wise investment decisions. In addition, he focused on how financial well-being has become an important factor for happiness, health and peace. He explained the various market structures & types of Mutual funds. He discussed the best schemes, plans and options related to investments in Mutual Funds.

Workshop on Data Analysis using SPSS

Prof. of Statistics and Research Department of Commerce, Shri Shankar Lal Shasun Jain College for Women, was the resource person. IIC Impact Lecture Session I


The Lecture session I on 24th Sep. '21 started in an eloquent way with Principal presenting the welcome and presidential address to the virtual gathering. She expressed the pleasure in hosting the program and the institution was

one among the few selected colleges to conduct such creative occasions. Institution's Innovation Council Impact Lecture Session I have had two experts from the reputed organisations to address students regarding start-ups and incubation centres. The first speaker, Dr. V. Naveen Kumar, Founder and Director, ImmuGenix Biosciences Pvt. Ltd., began the session with a small introductory note on his organisation. The core part of his lecture started with the definition of innovation and the difference between inventions and scientific inventions. He then moved on to explain the types of innovation, also known as the innovation wheel, where he discussed some of the major factors of innovation such as service, brand, customer engagement, network, product performance, etc., As a continuation to the previous segment, he emphasised the process of innovation, beginning with empathy, defining the innovation idea, its prototype and finally testing the final product. In this particular fragment, he demonstrated the way in which any innovative concept had to travel the above-mentioned stages for effective result. After a profound elucidation on the importance of bringing quality innovative proposals, he spoke on the role and significance of entrepreneurs in any society. He quoted some of the organisations like OYO which was initiated as a small-scale unit and later got transformed into enormous establishments. Further, he indicated the disciplines such as Molecular biology, Microbiology, Biochemistry, Immunology, Genetics, Chemical engineering and Cell Biology which towered demands in crops, drugs, vaccines, diagnostics and livestock productions. He continued to cite a few firms like Osteo3d, Smart Scope, Poorti, IMOV Motiontech, Tjay etc. Towards the end, he briefed the methods to initiate in setting up a Start-Up and its phases. In his closing address, he highlighted some of the



government funding sectors such as BIRAC, Make in India and NITI Aayog which lend hand to the promising entrepreneurs in the field of Molecular biology. Questionnaire session for the first speaker was hosted by Mrs. Srividhya, Asst. Prof. of Commerce. She brought forward some of the basic queries like the primary requirement in establishing a start-up and the way to sustain as an entrepreneur after laying the foreground. Also Ms. Menaha of III B. Sc Biochemistry has asked the speaker regarding the procedure to start an incubation centre. The expert gave his perceptions over the asked questions with the needed insights.

The expert talk 2 began with the second speaker, Dr. Priya Elamvazhuthi, Senior Manager, IITM Bioincubator, IIT Madras Research Park, Taramani, started the session with the function of start-up incubators. She continued to specify the UN Sustainable Development Goals which helped the young aspirants to identify the domains to be focused which are of high demand. She proceeded to give an extensive report on the funding agencies such as Sitare, EYUVA fellowship, BIG, BIPP, LEAP, ACE, etc., and their fund scale to diverse set of entrepreneurs. She demonstrated on a vast list of Bio Incubators ranging across all sorts of firms. In the forthcoming session, she enlightened the students with the objectives, infrastructure of incubation cells with high-end facilities and equipment of IITM. To educate the students in utilising the aforementioned amenities, she provided a detailed presentation on the application process, incubation model and services given to the approaching candidates. Three videos of start-up innovations were played to illuminate students to come up with constructive innovative projects. She mentioned the way IITM BI provides multi-faceted launch platforms where candidates are



educated, trained and given funds to lay a firm. Dr. Priya also provided the programmes which allow the faculty members alongside students in forming a start-up. She continued to mention the IITM's collaborations with industries such as ETA. As additional information, she even introduced the team of IITMBI where she is part of it. Before she concluded, she gave a virtual tour of IITM Research Park's external and internal infrastructure for the benefit of students. During the discussion part, Mrs. Prasanna, Asst. Prof. of Economics, had put forth major questions like, IITM Research Park's tie-up with nongovernmental organisations for research, and acceptance of common people's project proposals. The speaker clarified all the queries with detailed components.

IIC Impact Lecture Session II

On 12th Oct. '21, the second session titled "The Paradigm of New Age Entrepreneurship" began with Principal's special address appreciating the College's Innovation Cell for conducting successfully the second session in the IIC Impact Lecture Series. Dr. Rajachitra Manivannan, Asst. Prof. of Corporate Secretaryship, Dwaraka Doss Govardhan Doss Vaishnav College, highlighted the way India was being the fastest growing Start-up ecosystem at the world level. She continued to talk about the scenario of New Age Entrepreneurships and the success behind it. While speaking about the latter she quoted her personal experience being an entrepreneur in achieving the triumph. She shared some of the key factors of laying a successful entrepreneurial platform including versatility, risk taking, decision making and effective people skills. So he mentioned the significant current approach of entrepreneurship as not just being the profit-making podium but also the impact it creates on the society. She continued to mention the top 10 entrepreneurs in India. When talking about the important role of creativity in New Age Entrepreneurship, she quoted Pooja Kaul, who makes beauty products out of Donkey's milk. She concluded the session with some of the mentions of New Age Business ideas. During the questionnaire session, students raised questions for which the speaker gave appropriate understandable answers. One of the questions was regarding the major problems of entrepreneurship. To which the expert answered that sustaining would be the most challenging since there were a huge number of entrepreneurs budding every day.



The second session on "Legal and Ethical Ways for a Start-up" was presented by Dr. Padmaja Priyadarshini B. N., Entrepreneur, Senior Statistician & Resource Person. The speaker began her initial address on MASLOW 2.0 pyramids which explain the immediate needs of humans that was explained psychologically. She proceeded to discuss the structuring of start-ups, various forms of entities, characteristics of different stages in start-ups like Bootstrapping to the students. She even had a quiz time during her presentation where she clarified the possible doubts that students might have by herself. She explained some of the important legal traits in laying out a business such as documentation that includes Offer Letters, Employment Agreements, Intellectual Property Assignment Agreement and many others. At the end of the session, she addressed the seven dangers of human virtue and 13 commandments that every entrepreneur must remember.



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Funding Opportunities for Biotech Innovators & Entrepreneur





Dr. Prachi Kaushik, Manager, Investment (BIRAC) was the speaker of the session. The speaker offered awareness on various funding schemes such as BIG, BIPP, SIBRI, PACE and many such schemes. The session gave an enormous exposure for the benefits of people who are looking forward to launching startups and to the academies and industries in the biotech sectors. The session extended its territory in guiding entrepreneurs about funds and grants to start ideation and POC to the mature stage of commercialization.

My Journey in Pharma Business as a Successful Entrepreneur

The session with a welcome note on 27th Jan. '22 started with the principal's advice to make use of the webinar as it was rare to listen first-hand of the ups and downs that a business man would meet in the career. Followed by her address, Mr. Naveed, Founder and Director, Synerheal Pharmaceuticals Pvt. Ltd. in turn, began the session with a small virtual activity which addressed the way to simplify and solve the complicated situations in both business and life. He continued that at times continuous desire for change would lead to being in the comfortable zone with nil progress. In order to overcome this, one would have set priorities and proper direction for the proceedings. He addressed the need to overcome from giving excuses when an assigned task was not completed by people. The points mentioned above would help the youngsters to lay a successful foundation in the business they would begin with, he continued. Further he proceeded to quote some of the organisations such as, Lucious, UpGrad, Urban Company and many more, which had been started by young people in the recent years. He strongly stressed on the importance of making and choosing choices in one's career. He explained the key to success was to think like 10% of the people as the remaining 90% had always made the obvious and easier ideas and solutions. He offered the key dimensions that one must keep in mind on this critical journey. They were, one, to make a unique solution, two, to make the solution accessible to laymen and three, to make it affordable. He concluded his address with this piece of information on the way Navy Seals of the US would recruit people. He said the people would be selected not based on their physical strength but how far they would stand to save the people standing next to them during the frontline duty. Thus, he concluded saying that teamwork would always have to be the most important factor in bringing any business to its victory. During the questionnaire segment of the session, the speaker shared his views on finding the right business and time to step in.

Mr. Mathew Kuruvilla, Entrepreneur in IT & Direct Selling was the speaker. He began the session with the story of a Scientist and his Chauffeur which was indeed about Scientist Albert Einstein. The story emphasized the importance of bearing intelligence to be a successful individual in life. He proceeded the session by briefing the seven tips that one must remember in order to lead an organized and meaningful life. The seven tips were, to have a big dream,



to have a burning desire, to learn to set goals, to choose the right mentor, to enjoy the journey, to choose to be different and to just do it. While briefing the tips he quoted many inspirational achievers such as Wright Brothers, Sundar Pichai, CEO of Google, Shantanu Narayen, CEO and President, Adobe, Leena Nair, Global CEO of French Fashion House Chanel, Former President Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam, Mr. Mohandoss Karamchand Gandhi and Swami Vivekananda. Towards the end of the webinar, he insisted the need to be innovative and updated with the recent trends around us to sustain in any business without any kind of halt. At last he presented a brief note on the five biggest trends in 2021. The participants were curious to learn the tips parallelly with the acquaintance of great personalities. They were able to relate to the webinar as it was lively and felt wonderful to listen about familiar personalities with unfamiliar information.

On 15th Feb. 2022, Mr. Babu Vincent, Founder and Managing Director, Service Square, was invited to introduce, educate and tackle the technical hindrances in functioning a business in terms of "Problem Solution and Product Market Fit". After the formal proceedings, Mr. Babu Vincent, embarked his presentation with the statement that every business would have a reason to be established and it would aim at solving problems of the people. With that note, he continued to explain the ways to measure problem solution fit in business. By defining the term Product Market Fit and Stages of Customer Development, he continued to make the participants understand the concepts. The speaker shared his business foundation and its proceedings. Towards the end, he stated that in the next 10 years there would be a huge growth ever in any business and those businesses that fail to upgrade would disappear with no trace behind. The session came to an end answering the questionnaire session where he explained the purpose behind his business Service Square. The participants were exposed to the importance of backend management in business in order to not meet losses and to satisfy both the employees and customers.


Virtual Workshop

IIC along with IQAC conducted various virtual workshops for the students to have a better understanding of the current scenario in the world of industries.

- To educate students with the nature of small scale business proceedings and loan procedures which are sanctioned by the government, a virtual workshop on "Entrepreneurship Skill, Attitude & Behaviour Development" was organised on 17th Feb. '22 in which, Mrs. Udhayashanthi J., Proprietor, Tejas Industries was invited as the speaker. She began the session by sharing her experiences in her organization along with its history. She discussed the qualities that an entrepreneur must keep in order to run the established business long lastingly. She insisted that consistent determination would turn any business to success. She added that the success of the business also laid on systematic procedure and transparent dealing with the employees and customers. In the questionnaire session, she explained the procedures to get a loan at the bank. The participants had a peculiar exposure to listen to the first hand experiences of functions of business from a commoner. They related to the speaker as she had spoken in a simplified tongue of her business establishment.
- A Workshop on "Entrepreneurship and Innovation as Career Opportunity" was organised on 12th Feb 2022 to enlighten the students with the diverse features of being an entrepreneur and the qualities to possess in order to sustain in the field. The workshop began with a brief note with the introduction of the Guest speaker, Mr. Nivesh Babu VK, Proprietor, VGK Ventures, who insisted the participants to have close watch on the term. He then discussed the top five, referred to as rich, and the bottom ninety five percentages of people, the mediocre. He went on to explain the six parameters to be a successful entrepreneur. They were to exercise mental health, physical health, family, labour of love, spiritual health and social responsibility. After a brief elucidation on the parameters, he introduced the two circles of entrepreneurship which were, things we could control that was exercised by the rich to sustain without interruption and things we could not control that was exercised by the mediocre, so they could not seem to have progress and remained in the bottom level. The speaker highlighted the Gig economy which is a trend set since the pandemic period and which was practiced by business people

largely. The concept states the way business people were no longer willing to employ people rather they preferred to establish tie-ups with entrepreneurs. In the second segment of the program, the speaker mentioned the qualities which an individual must habituate in order to be an entrepreneur. They were to have the reading habit, to have good plans, to have midterm and long term goals and to have a logical and magical mindset. As it is important to have goals in any business, the speaker enlightened the participants with the kinds of goals that one could practice. The goals are survival, status, financial freedom goals, purpose goal and thanking note goal. In the proceeding segment, he insisted on how significant it was for an entrepreneur to invest time in a productive manner. During the final segment, he explained the four types of quadrants (EBSI) for the way people earned money commonly. They were, being an employee, a business owner, a self-employed and an investor. He added that an entrepreneur has to make sure that he covered the quadrants except for being in the employee cell. The participants enjoyed the session as it was not a presentation but a kind of storytelling which contained all the serious prospects of entrepreneurship.

- A virtual Workshop on “Design Thinking, Critical Thinking and Innovation Design” was conducted on 24th Feb. 2022 to edify students with the acquaintance of design, creative and critical thinking with the blend of innovation. Mrs. R.



Hemalatha, Assistant professor, Department of Visual Communication, SA College of Arts and Science, addressed the virtual gathering who began the workshop with the absolute essence of design thinking and its significance in solving problems. She then explained the five stages of design thinking, discovery, interpretation, ideation, experimentation and evolution. The speaker continued her presentation with productive thinking, its hindrances, critical thinking and the ways to improve it. She went on to talk about honing creative thinking skills efficiently. During the last part of her presentation she differentiated creative and critical thinking to the participants. The participants were content to learn the various thinking processes in dealing with employees and to establish a fine environment in the business scenario.
